THE CONSTITUTION OF THE NIPISSING DISTRICT SOCCER CLUB

Article 1: NAME

The Name of this club shall be the Nipissing District Soccer Club, hereinafter referred to as the Club or NDSC. The headquarters of the Club shall be located within the District Boundaries of the Soccer North Eastern Ontario District Association, hereinafter referred to as the District Association or Soccer North Eastern Ontario.

Article 2: OBJECTIVES

The Club shall have the following objectives:

- 1. To promote and develop the game of soccer, both indoor and outdoor, within its boundaries.
- 2. To help individuals to develop their character as resourceful and responsible Members of their community by providing opportunities, through the game of soccer, for their mental, physical, social and leadership development

Article 3: AFFILIATIONS

The Club shall be a Member of the **Soccer Northeastern Ontario District Association (SNE)** and shall follow the published rules of the SNE and Ontario Soccer. The Club is subject to the published rules in declining order of authority of the following governing organizations to which it is affiliated:

- 1. Ontario Soccer
- 2. The District Association (SNE)
- 3. The Club

Article 4: MEMBERSHIP

Categories—The Club has two classes of Membership:

- a) Regular Member An individual that meets the requirements of registration, is registered as a member of the Club and has agreed to abide by the Clubs Governing Documents.
- b) Governor Member –Any individual elected or appointed as a Director of the Club.

Although an individual may qualify for, and be registered under, more than one of the above categories, each individual holds only one Membership in the Club, and is entitled to one vote at Members' meetings.

A player shall become a regular Member when approved by the Club's Registrar; **However, in the** case of a player at or under the age of eighteen (18) can be represented by one of the following: a parent or legal guardian at general meetings

Fees

Membership fees for regular Members shall be set annually by the Board of Directors and ratified by the Membership at a Members meeting of the Club.

Discipline of Member

A member may be fined, censured, suspended or expelled from Membership for cause and only after charges have been laid in accordance with the Club's published rules and a hearing held in accordance with the Club's and Ontario Soccer's published rules. An individual whose membership has been suspended loses all rights of membership until the suspension has been terminated.

Player, team and team official discipline for game infractions is governed in accordance with the procedures published by Ontario Soccer.

Any Member who infringes the Articles or rules of the Club or brings the Club into disrepute, may be reprimanded, suspended or expelled from the Club after a hearing by the Board of Directors of the Club at which hearing the Member is entitled to attend.

Termination of Membership

Membership in the Club shall be deemed to have been terminated:

- 1. If the Member submits a signed letter of resignation to the Club
- 2. If the Member is expelled by the Club's Board of Directors
- 3. If the Member is no longer registered with the Club

Article 5: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Club shall be governed by a Board of Directors which shall consist of at least eight (8) individuals, or such number not to be less than three (3) as may be amended from time to time in accordance with the Club's By-Laws. These individuals shall hold the positions of:

President Vice-President Secretary Treasurer Registrar Director – three (3)

Each director shall chair one of three committees (Youth, Women and Men). These committees shall run the day to day activities of their leagues in all respects except discipline. All decisions and budgets must be provided to the Club's Board of Directors for approval in writing.

Members of these committees shall be appointed by the Club's Board upon recommendation from the NDSC President and elected chair of that committee.

Each Committee shall consist of the elected chair and five (5) members.

A Director may hold more than one position.

A Director shall be eighteen (18) years of age or older, shall not be an undischarged bankrupt and shall be a Regular Member of the Club.

A Director shall serve for a term of two years or until his or her successor is elected or appointed.

After an initial Board of Directors has been elected, the positions of President, Treasurer, Registrar and one (1) Director shall be elected in even numbered years while the positions of Vice-President, Secretary, and two (2) Directors shall be elected in odd numbered years.

Director Vacancy

A Director has the right to resign her or his position by submitting a signed letter of resignation to the Club.

A vacancy on the Board of Directors and their respective position(s) held, caused by death, or resignation which has been accepted by the Board of Directors, shall be filled by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The successor Director shall hold his or her incumbent's position(s) for the remainder of the term being filled.

Removal of Director

No member of the Board of Directors shall be removed for arbitrary reasons but may be removed if the Director is unable to perform the duties expected of the position due to, but not limited to, any of the following reasons:

- if she/he becomes incapable of performing the business of the Club
- if she/he is absent from two or more meetings of the Board without satisfactory reason
- if she/he no longer resides in reasonable proximity to the Club
- If she/he becomes, or is discovered to be, an undischarged bankrupt; or

The Director has compromised the integrity of the Club due to, but not limited to, any of the following reasons:

- If she/he has been found guilty of an offence under the Harassment Policy of the Ontario Soccer
- If she/he has been found guilty of an offence involving violence under the Discipline Policy of Ontario Soccer
- if she/he has failed to properly account for monies or other property belonging to the Club
- If she/he has been found guilty of a criminal offence regardless of whether or not the offence directly affected the Club.

A Member of the Board of Directors holding his or her respective position(s), as Director or other position(s), may be removed from office by the Board of Directors for good and sufficient cause by a 2/3's vote of the Board of Directors present, provided notice to remove the Director has been given to all Directors of the Club. If a Director is removed by the Board of Directors, the Board of Directors may appoint a successor to the position(s) for the remainder of the term(s) being filled.

A Member of the Board of Directors may also be removed from office for good and sufficient cause at a meeting of the Members of the Club provided notice to remove the Director has been given to persons entitled to attend the Members' meeting. If a Director is removed at a Members' meeting, the Members entitled to vote may elect a successor to fill all position(s) held by the removed Director for the remainder of the term(s) being filled.

Conflict of Interest and Standards of Conduct

The Directors shall be subject to the Conflict of Interest Policy – Appendix A of the Ontario Soccer Policies Document

Duties of Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall conduct the business of the Club during the periods between general meetings of the Club and in accordance with the authority granted to it in the published rules of the Club

The Board of Directors shall be responsible for the appointment and renewal of appointments of all positions within the Club except for those positions elected by the Membership of the Club. This shall include the appointment of volunteers and paid positions such as the Club Head Coach, Technical Director and/or administrator positions within the Club's operations. The selection process and the appointments shall be based on procedures outlined in the Club's published rules.

The Board of Directors may also revoke, for cause, any appointment providing that it has followed the procedures for the revoking and appointment as outlined in the Club's published rules.

Duties of Directors

President

Except: As provided for in the Dispute Resolution Policy of Ontario Soccer, and where the President delegates the responsibility to another person,

The President shall preside at all members meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. The President shall be an ex officio member of all committees, except any nominations committee; shall appoint all chairs of standing and special committees subject to ratification by the Board; coordinate all duties of the Board, committees, and staff and shall be the spokesperson for the Club.

Vice-President

The Vice-President shall act in the absence of the President and shall have others powers as assigned by the Board of Directors.

Treasurer

The Treasurer shall ensure that full and accurate records are kept of the accounts of the Club; shall report to the Board of

Directors at least once per quarter (suggested January 1/April 1/July 1/October 1); and shall submit an Annual Report to the Annual General Meeting.

Secretary

The Secretary shall maintain a record of all minutes of the organization; maintain copies of all committee reports; notify officers and committee members of their election or appointment, furnish committees with those documents required to perform their duties; sign all certified copies of acts of the organization, unless otherwise specified in the Club's published rules; maintain record books in which bylaws, published rules and minutes are entered and have the current record books available at each meeting' send to the membership a notice of each general meeting; send to the Board of Directors notices of each meeting, conduct the general correspondence of the organization that is not the proper function of another office or committee; prepare, prior to each meeting in consultation with the presiding officer, an order of business; and, in the absence of the president and vice-president, preside until the immediate election or appointment of a new presiding officer.

Other Director Positions

The duties of other Director Positions shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Nominations and Elections

Nominations for positions on the Board of Directors may be made by any member at the Annual General Meeting or a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

Nominations and elections for positions open shall be held in the order of the positions listed in the Constitution.

Election shall be by secret ballot, but in the event only one candidate is nominated, no vote is required and the nominated candidate shall be declared elected by acclamation.

A majority of the votes cast shall be required to elect Directors. In the event no candidate receives a majority, the candidate with the least votes shall be dropped from the ballot and another vote shall be held.

Article 6: MEETINGS

An official notice of each meeting shall be given to all Members at least 14 days before the meeting is to be held, at such place, and at such date as the Board of Directors may determine. Such notification shall be by website notice, e-mail, fax, or any other method determined by the Members.

Twenty Five (25) voting members or 33% of the total number of teams both indoor and/or outdoor voting membership which is less shall form a quorum at all general meetings of the Club. Any question shall be decided by a majority of the votes unless otherwise required by this By-Law or other law.

Annual Members Meeting:

The Club shall hold its Annual General Meeting not later **than the end of November of the current year**. The agenda of the Annual General Meeting shall include:

- 13. Election of Officers
- 14. Any Other Business
- 15. Adjournment

Special Members Meeting:

A Special Members Meeting of the Club:

- a) May be called by the Board of Directors, or
- b) shall be called by the Board of Directors upon receipt of a written request submitted to the Club by registered mail, website, trace mail, courier service, hand delivery, fax or e-mail, signed by not less than 25 Members or 25% of the voting Membership, whichever is less, setting out the items of business to be conducted at the Special Members Meeting. The Special Members Meeting shall be held within 30 days of receipt of the written request from the Members.

Only the business set out in the notice of the Special Members Meeting shall be considered.

Voting at a Members Meeting:

Every regular member shall have the right to attend and speak at a Members Meeting but only each team both indoor and outdoor shall have a vote at a Members Meetings of the Club.

Every regular member shall have the right to attend and speak at members' meetings, but for anyone under the age of eighteen (18) a parent or legal guardian represent that player and may speak and ask questions.

Proxy Voting at Members Meeting:

Every regular member is entitled to speak and ask questions at a Members Meeting. However only teams can vote and may only carry one other vote by proxy for another team. The proxy vote granted by another team must be presented in writing before the start of the meeting.

The format for the proxy, and the issue, or issues, for which the proxy may be cast are as defined in the Rules and Regulations.

Board of Directors Meeting:

The Board of Directors shall meet 4 times per year, upon 14 days' notice given by the President and Secretary, at such place and time as the Board of Directors may determine.

A majority of the Members of the Board of Directors shall form a quorum at all meetings of the Board. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes where each director is entitled to cast one vote.

Article 7. Committee Meetings:

Committees (Adult Men, Adult Women and Youth) shall meet 4 times per year, upon 14 days' notice given by the Chair and Secretary of that committee, at such place and time as the Committee members may determine. Committees may meet more often as necessary.

A majority of the Members of a committee shall form a quorum at all meetings of the committee. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes.

OTHER COMMITTEES

The Membership at any general meeting, or the Board of Directors at any meeting of the Board, may establish a standing committee or special committee to carry out specific business or programs of the Club.

Article 8: PROCEDURES GOVERNING MEETINGS

All meetings of the Club shall be conducted in accordance with the most recently published Robert's Rules of Order newly Revised except as may be otherwise stipulated in this By-Law or other Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Article 9: BY-LAWS AND AMENDMENTS

(a) By-Law amendments may be proposed by the Board of Directors, or submitted by a Member to the Club

in writing at least 21 days prior to a general meeting of the Club; and must be approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, and by a 2/3's vote of the Membership voting in person or by proxy at a meeting of the Club duly called for that purpose.

Such notification shall be by website notice, e-mail, fax, or any other method determined by the Members.

Article 10: RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Club shall have Rules and Regulations which shall include, but not limited to, the following:

- a) discipline of a member: summary of charges regarding misconduct
- b) discipline of a Member: procedures for discipline hearing
- c) duties of Board of Directors: authority granted to Board regarding the business being conducted
- d) duties of Board of Directors: selection process and appointment process for the appointment and renewal of appointments to the League's paid and volunteer positions
- e) duties of Board of Directors: process for revoking appointments
- f) voting at Members Meeting: format for the proxy, and the issue, or issues, for which the proxy may be cast

The Board of Directors may approve and publish Rules and Regulations which are not inconsistent by this By-Law and are not inconsistent with the Rules and Regulations of a higher level governing organization.

Amendments to the Rules and Regulations may be made by a majority vote of the Board of Directors or the Voting Members at a Members Meeting.

Article 11: INDEMNITY

Members of the Board of Directors or other servants to the Club, their heirs, executors, administrators and estate and effects respectively shall be indemnified and saved harmless at all times by the Club against all costs, losses and expenses incurred by them respectively in or about the discharge of their respective duties, except such as happens from their own respective willful neglect or default.

Article 12: Finance

The financial statements of the Club shall be:

- a) Presented annually subject to the minimum requirements as defined in d);
- b) Based on a defined fiscal year end;
- c) Presented to members at the Annual General Meeting; and
- d) subject to the following size test based on financial statements of the previous year:
 - Audited, as defined by CPA Canada, by a public accountant if the Club's annual gross revenue is greater than or equal to \$100,000 or the Club has greater than or equal to 1000 registered players; or
 - ii) A Club can exempt itself from the requirement for an audit if the Club's annual gross revenue is greater than or equal to \$100,000 IF at a scheduled meeting of the members an Extraordinary Resolution is presented and 80% vote in favor of doing so. If the members vote in favor of the Extraordinary Resolution, then the annual financial reporting requirements are as follows;
 - Reviewed by a Public Accountant, through a Financial Review Engagement, as defined by CPA Canada, if the Club's annual gross revenue is less than \$100,000 but greater than or equal to \$75,000,or the club has less than 1000 but greater than or equal to 500 registered players; or
 - Signed with a Notice to Reader prepared by a Public Accountant, if the Club's annual gross revenue is less than \$75,000 but greater than or equal to \$10,000
 - iii) Completed by the Treasurer or designate, if the Club's annual gross revenue is less than \$10,

Article 13: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The Club shall adhere to the Dispute Resolution process as published and approved by Ontario Soccer. Any Member of the Club may initiate the Dispute Resolution process by communicating in writing to Ontario Soccer, with a copy to the Club and District Association, the nature and facts of the dispute. Ontario Soccer at its discretion, may proceed with the Dispute Resolution process by assigning one or more neutral persons to the dispute.

The Dispute Resolution process shall not to be used for game discipline which follows the normal discipline and appeals process.

The Club shall make available to any Member the Dispute Resolution process when requested.

Article 14: HARASSMENT

The Club shall adhere to the Harassment Policy as published and approved by Ontario Soccer.

The Harassment Policy shall apply to all employees, directors, officers, volunteers, coaches, game officials, administrators, players, Members and registrants of the Club.

Harassment is defined as any comment, conduct or gesture directed toward an individual or group of individuals which is insulting, intimidating, humiliating, malicious, degrading or offensive. It includes, but is not limited to, sexual harassment.

The Club shall make available to any Member the Harassment Policy when requested.

Article 15: APPEALS

- 1) Any Individual of the Club directly affected by a decision of the Club may appeal such decision.
- 2) A decision of the Club may be appealed to the District Association with which the Club is affiliated. The appeal shall be conducted in accordance with Ontario Soccer and District Association's published rules pertaining to appeals.
- 3) An individual shall not appeal a decision made by the Board of Directors regarding the Appointment, non-appointment, re-appointment or revocation of an appointment of an individual to any coach or administrator position within the Club's operations, except where the selection, appointment and revocation process outlined in the Club's published rules has not been followed.
- 4) An individual shall not appeal a decision made by the Club regarding a player's team assignment.

Article 16: DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Club, and after payment of all debts and liabilities, its remaining property shall be distributed or disposed of by the Board of Directors to one or more not-for-profit soccer related organizations, or any not-for-profit athletic community organizations, which operate solely in Ontario.

Article 17: DEFINITIONS/TERMINOLOGY

Terminology used in this By-Law shall have the same meaning as used by Ontario Soccer in its letters patent, By-Laws and published rules.
